


CHELSEA GORDON COLINROOBIE




JACOB BRENTNALL CASINO




ELIZABETH ARGUE TAYLORS ARM

As a 100% volunteer-based institution, the Ulladulla Volunteer Marine Rescue NSW is reliant on grants to maintain its state of readiness to save lives on the water. The local seaside community attracts tourism and recreational boaters who draw heavily on its life saving capabilities. Being exposed to salt air and near a beach location, the grant provided will be utilised to do maintenance work on the building. Marine Rescue is the only provider of 24/7 radio coverage for recreational and commercial boaters, and features significantly in providing food, water and medications to affected bushfire communities up and down the coast.

The Manilla Pony Club (MPC) is a committed and passionate team of volunteers. This project will enhance the kitchen and dining room areas and create a secure storage room. The refurbished facility will enable the MPC to work in collaboration with multiple community groups and deliver opportunities for social cohesion, improved environment, and recreational outcomes. As an inviting and more functional space, events will be easier to run and increase volunteer participation. This project is designed to stimulate the local economy by employing a local contractor and labourer and purchasing the much-needed refrigeration locally.

The Adelong Show Society Showground is used for their annual agricultural show and by various community groups and schools throughout the year. This project will upgrade two pavilions on the grounds with lighting, heating and cooling systems, and vermin-proof them for mice and birds. These improvements will make the pavilions a functional meeting place for more community groups and social events, increasing the local interest for nighttime functions. It is expected this project will bring more people to town, supporting the local economy.

LACMALAC SOLDIERS MEMORIAL HALL Organisation:

The Lacmalac Soldiers Memorial Hall hosts a variety of community groups but lacks adequate accessibility for those who rely on mobility aids. This project aims to build a concrete slab and connecting pathways around the hall, making it more accessible and safer for people of all abilities. These improvements will result in higher community events attendance, increasing the local food and supplies purchased for events, raising the demand on local transport services, and favouring the tourism over the weekends. Local indigenous communities will also benefit, as the hall is across the valley from Mt Naughton, a significant aboriginal landmark.



Young Minds Thrive's program, "Empowering Futures", is purposed to enhance child development in Nambucca Valley by bridging gaps in primary health screening rates, ensuring early identification of health concerns, developmental vulnerability and learning challenges. In the valley, one in three children start kindergarten developmentally vulnerabile, double the state and national average and urgent action is needed to break the vulnerability cycle and foster positive change. Through strategic screenings and targeted family and community partnerships, this program seeks to provide each child with professional assessments and essential developmental support, paving the way for a brighter future.
