

MEASURING HORSES AND PONIES

Horses, galloways, and ponies entered in classes for which the height is limited must be measured by the Official Measurer before competing. No exhibit shall be judged unless so measured.

THE OFFICIAL MEASURER WILL ATTEND THE SHOWGROUND ON WEDNESDAY, THURSDAY, FRIDAY, AND
SATURDAY, 26th, 27th, 28th, and 29th MARCH, AN
EXHIBIT WILL NOT BE MEASURED ON THE DAY IT IS
TO BE JUDGED.

When measuring a horse, galloway, or pony, an allowance of half $(\frac{1}{2})$ of on inch is ta be made for shoes. Where an exhibitor disagrees with the Official Measurer's figure for an animal which has been measured with shoes on he may, should he so desire, have it re-measured without shoes. The Official Measurer may, in his discretion, request the removal of shoes from any animal prior to measurement.

Should a horse, galloway, or pany be found by the Official Measurer to be over or under height for the class in which it has been entered it may be transferred to a corresponding horse, galloway, or pany class.

Horses, galloways, and panies will not be measured unless the breast plate showing their number in the class for which they are being measured is produced to the Official Measurer for the purpose of enabling him to impress same with a rubber stamp showing the official measurement and his initials.

Life measurement certificates will only be issued for horses, galloways, or ponies, seven years old or over. A Life Certificate shall not be issued unless, at the time of measurement, the exhibit is unshad.

The Official Measurer will attend the Showground on Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, and Saturday, 26th, 27th, 28th, and 29th March, between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. A pony will not be measured on the day it is to be judged. Should a pony be tound by the Official Measurer to be over or under height for the class in which it has been entered it may be transferred to a corresponding pony or horse saddle class.

Horses, galloways, and ponies will be measured by the Official Measurer, for Life Certificates on Tuesday, 8th April.
