### SPECIAL (ORAL) BEEF CATTLE JUDGING COMPETITION.

(SPECIAL PRIZES).—£10 10s., presented by The Australian Broadcasting Commission, 264 Pitt-st., Sydney. First, £5; second, £3; third, £2 10s. Restricted to first, second, and third prize winners in the Beef Cattle Judging Competitions, Classes 4 to 8. The Steward-in-Chief shall select four animals from a beef breed for judging. The competition will be conducted on lines similar to those obtaining for the animal classes but, in addition, competitors will be required to state reasons for their awards through a microphone and to answer such questions as the Judge might ask.

### CONDITIONS.

- The competitions shall be for competitors who have not reached their 27th birthday at time of competition. DATE OF BIRTH MUST BE SHOWN ON CERTIFICATE OF ENTRY. In substantiation of the age of any competitor, the Steward-in-Chief may call for a Statutory Declaration.
- The competition shall be open to students of Agricultural Colleges, Experiment Farms, Agricultural High Schools, Rural Schools, Junior Farmers' Clubs, and others outside the foregoing classifications within the prescribed age limits. In any class the number of competitors from an Agricultural College, High School, or like institution, shall be restricted to three. A student from any of the said institutions or Junior Farmers' Clubs shall not be eligible to compete unless he has been officially nominated by the institution or club to which he belongs. There shall be no restriction on the number of other individual competitors.
- "Post" entries and "Substitute" entries will not be accepted.
- The number of animals to be judged in each competition shall be four.
- Unless otherwise specified, there shall be a "breed" judge and an "assessor" judge.
- There shall be a judging time allowance of 25 minutes, within which all judging cards as supplied by the Society must be completed and handed to the Steward in charge.
- A competitor may enter in more than one of the specified groups, viz., Arabs, Clydesdales, Pony, Beef Cattle, Fat Cattle (any breed), Dairy Cattle, Goats, Pigs, Poultry (including Turkeys), but he is restricted to any one class in each group. (In the Agriculture classes this restriction does not apply.)

### ANIMAL CLASSES.

- The competitors and the judge will be provided with cards on which they will be required to record:—
  - the order in which they place the animals—  
(i) under specified headings;  
(ii) as final placings;
  - brief comments on each animal (e.g. point out any outstanding quality or defect, make comparable observations in relation to the other animals, give reasons for placings)—  
(i) under specified headings;  
(ii) under final placings;
- The maximum marks to be awarded for each section of the card are:—
  - for "Placings" (See 1a)—1a(i) five marks for each heading;  
1a(ii) fifteen marks for final placings; allotted as follows:—  
All correct—say ABCD .. .  
Single adjacent change (1 and 2, BACD; or 2 and 3, ACBD; or 3 and 4, ABDC) .. .  
Two adjacent changes (1 and 2, and 3 and 4, BADC) .. .  
All other placings .. .
  - for "Comments" (see 1b)—1b(i) under each heading 2 per animal;  
1b(ii) under final placings 4 per animal;
- The "assessor" judge will compare each competitor's card with that of the "breed" judge and will mark it in accordance with the previously agreed on rating. "Nil" or a reduced number of marks will be allotted for "placings" not supported by appropriate "comments."
- The competitor gaining the highest total number of points shall be the winner. In the event of a tie in total points, the marks awarded for comments on final placings—see 1b(ii)—will then be the deciding factor.
- At the conclusion of the judging in each class the "breed" judge will give a talk on judging and will discuss the exhibits judged.

Exhibitors are reminded that the Society's General Regulations apply to all sections of the Show and that the Special Regulations hereunder set out which apply to this section only are merely supplementary to the General Regulations.

**JUDGING WILL BE CARRIED OUT STRICTLY IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE STANDARDS OF THE ROYAL HORTICULTURAL SOCIETY OF NEW SOUTH WALES.**

Copies of the Standard Year Book of the Royal Horticultural Society of N.S.W. may be obtained from the Director, Royal Agricultural Society of N.S.W., Endeavour House, 33 Macquarie Place, Sydney (Box 4317, G.P.O.), or Hon. Secretary, Royal Horticultural Society of N.S.W., Blackbutts-rd., French's Forest, N.S.W., at a cost of 5/- plus postage.

Exhibits must be staged not later than 10 a.m. on the day exhibits are to be judged. THIS RULE WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED.

After the judges have completed their awards in each session, all cut blooms shall become the property of the Society and shall be taken over by the Superintendent of the Pavilion.

*Labelling and Arrangement of Exhibits.*—Each separate variety must be labelled with its scientific or individual common name, which must be written on a card which will be supplied by the Society. Exhibits not so marked, unless they are seedlings and marked as such, will be ineligible to compete. This rule will be rigidly enforced.

Non-competitive exhibits may be shown at the discretion of the Society and/or the Steward-in-Chief.

Under no circumstances shall any person canvass or book orders on the exhibits.

It shall be a condition of entry that exhibitors have become thoroughly conversant with the regulations and that they have complied with the provisions "that all exhibits entered were grown by and at the place of residence of the exhibitor making the entry". This regulation shall not apply to the Decorative Sections.
