PENALTY—NON-EXHIBITION OF GOATS.

In order to prevent the non-exhibition of animals which have been entered for the Show, thus causing unnecessary preparation, expense, and disarrangement of the Show Yard, any person making any entry will be subject to a fine of £1 for each entry of goats not exhibited, unless a certificate under the hand of exhibitor or his authorised agent be lodged with the Director of the Society before the day of Exhibition, to the effect that such non-exhibition is caused either by (1) the death of the animal or animals; or (2) contagious or infectious disease (confirmed by the explanatory certificate of a veterinary surgeon); or (3) by its becoming ineligible for the class in which it has been entered, or other reasonable cause. The non-payment of such fines to debar all persons owing them from exhibiting at future exhibitions of the Society.

JUDGING DAY AND EXHIBITION PERIOD.

Goats will be judged at 9 a.m., Thursday, 26th March, and will remain on exhibition on that day and until 5 p.m. on Easter Saturday, 28th March.

PARADERS' COMPETITION.

GENERAL REGULATION No. 67.

If a judge shall consider that any exhibit does not possess sufficient merit to deserve a prize in the class in which the exhibit is presented for judging, no prize shall be awarded.

SPECIAL GOAT REGULATIONS.

Exhibitors are reminded that the Society's General Regulations apply to all sections of the Show and that the Special Regulations hereunder set out which apply to this section only are merely supplementary to the General Regulations.

Goats must be registered in a Herd Book recognised by the Royal Agricultural Society of N.S.W., and proof of registration must accompany all entries for the Show. For particulars of the Goat Breeders' Society of Australia, apply to the Secretary, F. H. Berryman, Endeavour House, 33 Macquarie Place, Sydney; H. T. C. Marshall, Secretary, Western Australian Branch, 239-243 Adelaide Terrace, Perth.

The age of all goats to be calculated from the birth date shown on the kid record and/or registration form up to the official Judging day, Thursday, 26th March.

All Does will be milked dry, commencing at 5 p.m., Wednesday, 25th March, when an inspection will be made. The exhibitor or his representative to be present when the Does are being stripped out. Any Doe which in the opinion of the steward is carrying excessive milk shall be debarred from competition. Should the judge require any Doe to be milked out before making his award, same shall be done.

Any doe, entered as dry, if in milk at the time of the competition, may compete as a wet doe, and vice versa.

All goats shall be fed and attended to by the exhibitor while the goat remains on the Showground.

In awarding the Championship, the first prize winner in each class of the relative sub-section shall be eligible to compete.

In awarding the Reserve Championship, the first prize winner in each class of the relative sub-section, other than the exhibit to which the Championship has been awarded, shall be eligible to compete together with the second prize winner in the class in which the Champion was awarded first prize.

In awarding the Junior Championship, the first prize winner in each class in the relative sub-section shall be eligible to compete, provided that no exhibit shall be eligible to compete for the Junior Championship if it is over the age of two years and, in the case of a Saanen, if it is not a maiden.

In awarding the Reserve Junior Championship, the first prize winner in each class in the relative sub-section, other than the exhibit to which the Junior Championship has been awarded shall be eligible to compete together with the second prize winner in the class from which the Junior Champion was drawn, provided that no exhibit shall be eligible to compete for the Reserve Junior Championship if it is over the age of two years and, in the case of a Saanen, if it is not a maiden.

If a Champion or Reserve Champion shall be disqualified or shall be found to be unqualified to compete in the class for which it was entered, or to compete for the Championship or Junior Championship then the Championship or Junior Championship shall be awarded to the animal which was awarded the Reserve Championship or Reserve Junior Championship.

In all classes where only two or three prizes are offered, Very Highly Commended, Highly Commended, and Commended cards may be recommended at the discretion of the judge.

RAILWAY CERTIFICATES.

Certificates granting reduced rail carriage of goats, returning to the station they were trucked from must be obtained at the Superintendent's office. These certificates must be obtained before the Goats leave the ground and must be presented at the time of consignment. OTHERWISE FULL TRAINAGE WILL BE CHARGED. A concession rail certificate will not be issued unless the exhibit is returned to the station whence it was trucked within four weeks of the date of the forward journey.

DATES OF BIRTH FOR CLASSES RESTRICTED BY AGE.

Stated hereunder is an explanation regarding classes which restrict the eligibility of an exhibit by the fact of its age. The dates shown within the parentheses are those on, or between which, the exhibit must be born to enable it to compete in the class referred to immediately preceding the parentheses.

Over 5 years (Before 26th March, 1954); Over 4 years (Before 26th March, 1955); Over 4 years and not over 5 years (26th March, 1954—25th March, 1955); Not over 4 years (On or after 26th March, 1954); Over 3 years and not over 4 years (26th March, 1955—25th March, 1956); Not over 3 years (On or after 26th March, 1956); Over 2 years and not over 3 years (26th March, 1956—25th March, 1957); Over 2 years (Before 26th March, 1957); Not over 2 years (On or after 26th March, 1957); Over 17 months and not over 2 years (26th March—25th Oct., 1957); Over 12 months and not over 2 years (26th March, 1957—25th March, 1958); Over 12 months and not over 17 months (26th Oct., 1957—25th March, 1958); Not over 12 months (On or after 26th March, 1958); Over 7 months and not over 12 months (26th March—25th Aug., 1958); Over 5 months and not over 7 months (26th Aug.—25th Oct., 1958); Not over 5 months (On or after 26th Oct., 1958).

Note.—The following classes are arranged in the order in which they will be judged.

TYPE AND PRODUCTION CLASSES.

Conditions.

Exhibits entered in Classes 1 to 7 are restricted to Does which have qualified for a State Official Production Certificate not later than 28th February, prior to the next Royal Easter Show. The age of each Doe shall be calculated from the birth date shown on the kid record and/or registration form, but the points for production shall be based on the best official production record within the period 1st January, 1956, to 28th February, 1959. Furthermore, the points shall be calculated on the basis of twice-a-day milking. Yields of Does milked three times a day will be reduced in proportion to twice-daily milkings. The production shall be brought to a mature age standard.

Each exhibit shall be judged for type and production, viz.:—60 points for type and 40 points for milk and butter-fat production.

Each Doe shall be credited on the bases of one point for every 100lb. of milk or part thereof over her age standard with a maximum of 20 points. Each Doe shall also be credited with one point for every 5lb. of butter-fat or part thereof over the mature age standard with a maximum of 20 points.

In the event of two or more Bucks securing an equal number of points the owner of the Buck gaining the greatest number of 1st prizes shall be the winner.

GOAT PARADERS' COMPETITION. CONDITIONS.

This competition is for the purpose of educating and encouraging goat exhibitors and attendants to parade exhibits before a judge in the most efficient manner. Suitable attire of competitors and condition of animals, although highly desirable, shall not be the deciding factor except in the case of equality of competitors.

The Paraders' Competition shall be restricted to exhibitors and their herdsmen.

The competition shall commence as soon as the exhibits in each class enter the Judging Ring on Thursday, 26th March. The selected competitors shall be those who, in the opinion of the competition selectors, parade their animals in the most efficient manner. A competitor shall not be eligible to be awarded points unless he has paraded on at least three occasions wearing the armband number allocated for the competition. Account will be taken of difficulties which a competitor may have in controlling an exhibit.

Each competitor shall be allotted an armband number which must be worn in each class. The armband number shall be the only form of identification.

CONDITIONS.

PREFACE.

The Fat Lamb Carcass Competitions will be governed by the general Rules and Regulations of the Royal Agricultural Society and by the Special Regulations hereunder.

The Special Conditions are designed to permit exhibitors to provide exhibits between the 1st July and the closing date for entry (30th January, 1959) at an age and in a condition most suitable for the export trade.

In order to ensure that the carcasses judged are representative of "half a car load" (not less than 50 lambs) furnished by the exhibitor the Special Regulations contemplate that in respect of each entry each exhibitor will submit at least 50 lambs from which a representative selection of six will be made and after slaughtering three of the carcasses from these six will be regarded as the exhibitor's exhibit and will be judged at the N.S.W. State Abattoir, Homebush, in competition with other exhibits.

Facilities are provided to enable the draft or "half car load" of lambs to be sent to the exhibitor's selling agent at any time between 1st July and the closing date of entry so that this selection of six lambs can then be made and the carcasses held in the freezing chambers of the N.S.W. State Abattoir until all exhibitors' carcasses are ready for submission to the Judge.

SPECIAL REGULATIONS.

- The following Special Regulations apply to entries and exhibits for the 1959 Royal Easter Show but may be revised in respect of entries or exhibits for any subsequent Royal Easter Show.
- The closing date for entry for the 1959 Royal Easter Show is Friday, 30th January, 1959.
- LAMBS ARE TO BE SLAUGHTERED AT N.S.W. STATE ABATTOIR, HOMEBUSH BAY, SYDNEY.
- Each exhibitor shall nominate an agent at Flemington sale yards to act as his Agent and shall notify the Director of the Society of such nomination in writing and such notification shall be given at least seven clear days before the despatch of the exhibitor's "half car load" of lambs pursuant to the provisions hereinafter contained. The Royal Agricultural Society of N.S.W. will nominate an agent for any exhibitor whose "half car load" of lambs is to be forwarded to the SYDNEY MEAT PRESERVING COMPANY (LIMITED) or the RIVERSTONE MEAT CO. PTY., LTD., provided advice is received within the aforementioned stipulated period.
- Applications for entry may be lodged with the Society at any time between the 1st day of July, 1958, and the closing date for entry but the Society shall not be called upon to accept or reject an application until after the closing date for entry and no act on the part of the Society prior to formal acceptance of the application in writing shall be regarded as or constitute an acceptance of the application.
- An exhibitor shall be restricted to three entries in any one class.
- An exhibitor shall consign or deliver to his nominated agent at Flemington sale yards, or the Sydney Meat Preserving Company (Limited), Auburn, or the Riverstone Meat Co. Pty., Ltd., Riverstone, a "half car load" of lambs comprising a minimum of 50 head.
- At least SEVEN CLEAR DAYS' PREVIOUS NOTICE in writing of the date when the "half car load" of lambs will reach Flemington, Auburn, or Riverstone and be delivered to the nominated agent shall be given to the Director. Lambs must be consigned to Flemington, Auburn, or Riverstone whether they are sold on the property or are to be submitted for public auction at Flemington. Lambs will not be accepted for slaughter unless this provision is observed.
- The lambs comprising the "half car load" must all be lambs bred by the exhibitor and every such lamb must be of suitable age and condition for the export trade.
- Each exhibitor shall furnish particulars, in writing to the Director, of the breed of the sire and dam of the respective lambs comprising the "half car load" and such particulars shall accompany the application for entry.
- The six lambs of each "half car load" shall be indelibly and clearly marked by the exhibitor so that they may be identified as comprising the "half car load" and be distinguished from the lambs comprising any other "half car load" of the same exhibitor.
- The expression "half car load" means a mob of lambs capable of being contained in a sheep van for transport by road or rail.
- The following rules and procedure will apply to each "half car load" which shall comprise not less than 50 lambs—
 - An exhibitor may select and raddle his lambs prior to their despatch to Flemington, Auburn, or Riverstone. Upon receipt of the consignment of the "half car load" by the relative agents at Flemington, Auburn, or Riverstone, if a selection has not already been made, the exhibitor, or failing him the Society, will arrange for an expert, who will be a representative of the New South Wales Meat Exporters, to select and raddle, for the purpose of identification, six lambs which must be representative of the bulk of the lambs comprised in the "half car load".
 - The six lambs so selected and the balance of the lambs comprising the "half car load" shall be subject to inspection by an Inspection Committee (known as the "R.A.S. Stewards' Fat Lamb Inspection Committee").
 - The decision of the said Committee as to whether the lambs comprising the "half car load" are of suitable age and condition for the export trade and whether the six selected lambs are representative of the lambs comprising the "half car load" and as to any other matter which may be referred to the Committee shall be accepted as final.
 - The balance of the "half car load" after the six lambs have been selected shall be at the disposal of the exhibitor.
 - The six selected lambs shall at all times be subject to the control of the Society but subject thereto may be sold by the exhibitor's nominated agent on behalf of the exhibitor on the condition that such lambs shall remain subject to the provisions of these Regulations.
